# REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2017

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2017. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

## **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

## Objectives and aims

The main objectives of the charity are:

- 1) the advancement of amateur sport by promoting the game of duplicate bridge for the public benefit.
- 2) the advancement of the education of young persons in full time education in the playing of duplicate bridge.

In support of Object (1) the charity has :-

- sought to promote and develop bridge as a social and community activity with particular health benefits in maintaining effective brain function and providing opportunities to foster friendships and community spirit.
- trained bridge teachers and tournament directors.
- produced and sold books and educational materials for bridge players.
- produced books and educational materials to assist students.

In support of Object (2) the charity has :-

- publicised the educational merits of duplicate bridge as an activity for the development of young people.
- promoted the encouragement of young bridge players within the English Bridge Union Limited, County Associations and Bridge Clubs.
- provided and organised tuition for young people to learn duplicate bridge at a week long Summer School.

# Social investments

The Charity has made significant progress on its three medium term projects and will complete work on two of them in 2017/18. It has also established three longer-term projects to begin in 2017/18.

#### Grantmaking

The Trustees have an approved policy for grant making which is publicised on the Charity's website. The budget they approved for it was not fully spent during the year.

# ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

The main achievements of the Charity during the year were :-

- Making significant progress on all three medium term projects.
- Groundwork on recruiting a chief executive.
- Holding two Simultaneous Pairs fundraising events that, together, generated a net income of £19,332.
- Identifying longer-term projects to further the objectives of the Charity.

#### FINANCIAL REVIEW

# Principal funding sources

The Charity raised funds from :-

- 1. Surplus on primary purpose trading.
- 2. Fundraising two national events (Autumn and Spring Simultaneous Pairs).
- 3. Donations.

All expenditure has been spent on furthering the main objectives of the Charity. In making decisions about expenditure, the Trustees have had regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on Public Benefit.

All cash is held at the bank.

The Balance Sheet shows an investment of £96 which is the value of the wholly owned subsidiary South Buckinghamshire Bridge Centre Limited. The Trustees have written down the value of the investment to the nominal value of the issued shares, as the subsidiary has ceased to trade and will be wound-up in due course. This subsidiary donated £15,060 to the charity (2016: £43,000).

#### Reserves policy

EBED's Reserves policy has been formulated by the Trustees on the basis of future anticipated needs. 2016/17 was a further year of building up reserves for investment in three major projects starting in 2017/18 and planned to continue through to end 2021/22. These are:

- 1. To overhaul and improve all the day-to-day operations of the Charity to reduce cost, improve service quality and improve governance,
- 2. To implement the recommendations of the Board's Advisory Group on Education,
- 3. To expand EBED's training business, with the aims of introducing new services and to increase the surplus from trading activities that can then be re-invested in the charity for public benefit.

It is estimated that these projects will require an investment from reserves of around £120k - £150k over the 4 years, which will reduce the reserves to a level of around £150k - £180k.

The first and essential pre-cursor of this investment was to recruit a dedicated CEO and this was accomplished in July 2017.

The Trustees therefore consider unrestricted reserves in the region of £300,000 for 2017/18 to be appropriate.

#### Funds in deficit

There are no funds in deficit at the Balance Sheet date.

# Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a constitution, and constitutes as a charitable incorporated organisation (CIO).

## Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The trustees have been selected as follows:-

4 appointed by the English Bridge Union Limited

3 appointed by the Trustees of English Bridge Education & Development.

# Related parties

The charity has a close working relationship with the National Body for duplicate bridge in England - the English Bridge Union Limited. The EBU makes significant charitable donations to the charity.

# INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT TO THE TRUSTEES OF ENGLISH BRIDGE EDUCATION AND DEVELOPMENT

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 March 2017 set out on pages five to eleven.

## Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year (under Section 144(2) of the Charities Act 2011 (the 2011 Act)) and that an independent examination is required. The charity's gross income exceeded £250,000 and I am qualified to undertake the examination by being a qualified member of Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales.

It is my responsibility to:

- examine the accounts under Section 145 of the 2011 Act
- to follow the procedures laid down in the General Directions given by the Charity Commission (under Section 145(5)(b) of the 2011 Act); and
- to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

## Basis of the independent examiner's report

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commission. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently no opinion is given as to whether the accounts present a 'true and fair view' and the report is limited to those matters set out in the statements below.

# NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2017

## 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland'EFA, the and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

#### Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

## **Expenditure**

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

#### **Taxation**

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

#### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

# 13. RELATED PARTY DISCLOSURES

During the year the charity received donations amounting to £75,599 (2016: £63,259) from The English Bridge Union Limited with which the charity has a close working relationship and which appoints the majority of the Board of Trustees. The charity received £6,801 (2016: £16,741) from The English Bridge Union Limited to cover the cost of discounts provided by the charity to its members. In addition the Charity received free advertising space in that company's publication 'English Bridge' with an estimated market value of £3,120 (2016: £2,220).

The charity also received donations from its subsidiary company South Buckinghamshire Bridge Centre Limited amounting to £15,060.

Mr G Ames, a trustee, was paid £851 for teaching services provided to the charity during the year. The rates charged were in accordance with standard teaching rates paid to third parties. There were no amounts outstanding to him as at 31 March 2017.
