2) Dummy has ♠QJ2 ♥KQ3 ♦Q43 ♣Q2 left and won the last trick with ♠K. Clubs are trumps. Declarer now asks for the Q, after which dummy asks; 'which queen'?

Declarer may choose any of them.

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3) East opens 2♦ (weak two in diamonds) out of turn and not accepted. North to call opens with 1♣ and East overcalls with 1♦.

West has to pass for one round only.

Declarer says 'small spade' then notices the ♠6 and says 'no, I mean the ♠7'. The change to the ♠7 is allowed.

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11) In an uncontested auction N: 2♣ S: 2♥; N: 4NT S 4♥. S thought he was replying to 4♣ Gerber where 4♥ would show one ace.

S can change his call to 5♦ because that would show a one ace response to Blackwood.

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12) North bids 1NT out of turn. It is not accepted and North subsequently passes throughout. East ends up declarer in 4♠. East can ask South to lead a specified suit.

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13) During play dummy may ask a defender about a possible revoke before it becomes established.

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14) Declarer leads from hand when the lead is in dummy. The defenders cannot agree where they want the lead from. In case of dispute the first one to speak commits the partnership.

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15) After a long and complicated auction South plays in 4♠ doubled. West leads ♣A and the bidding cards are put away. Declarer plays a singleton club from dummy and right hand opponent follows with a small club. At this point declarer can ask who doubled.

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16) West opens 1NT (12 to 14). North hesitates for some time (which is agreed) and passes. East passes and South bids 2♠ holding ♠Q107653 ♥K7 ♦K7 ♣432.

Without waiting for the auction or play to finish the TD stops the board being played and says that the board is cancelled and awards 40% to NS and 60% to EW. This is this the correct ruling.

18) During a later round N/S Pair 1 are playing against E/W Pair 15. They play the first two boards of the round so slowly that there is not enough time for them to play the third board. The TD stops them from playing the board.

Which is the correct way for the board to be scored?

- a) The TD enters 'Not Played' onto the traveller or into the 'BridgeMate', so no result is recorded.
- b) The TD enters 'Average' to both pairs onto the traveller or into the 'BridgeMate'.
